Unforgettable conductors such as Jeffrey Tate, Daniele Gatti, and Zubin Mehta – and world-renowned soloists like Stefano Bollani, Erika Pluhar, Maurizio Pollini, Ute Lemper, Martin Grubinger, and others have graced the stage.

The Festival Dolomites is much more than a stage – it is a place of encounter, inspiration, and shared wonder. It attracts an audience eager to listen, feel, and be part of the experience – with open hearts and attentive ears.

Special thanks go to our long-standing president Christian Gartner, his dedicated collaborators Hanspeter Fuchs and Philipp Moser, and to Dr. Josef Duregger for his curatorial imprint on exhibitions featuring artists like Annemarie Laner, Christian Stecher, Will-ma Kammerer, Julia Bornefeld, and Friedrich Feichter.

Today, the Festival is artistically led by Christoph Bösch (CH) and Josef Feichter (I) – and has evolved into an event that combines sonic brilliance, stylistic openness, and emotional intensity.
